### Cashier Hasseltine Short.

Lancaster, S. C., Sept. 26—  
Ernest Hasseltine, acting as assist-  
ant cashier in the bank of Lancas-  
ter and a young man of only 18  
years of age, has, during the past  
month, been speculating in wheat  
and cotton futures through S. Mun,  
Sons & Co., and Clapp & Co., of  
New York city. The sequel is that  
the bank has lost through him  
\$3,500. Col. Springs, president of  
the bank, accidentally learned Sat-  
urday that the young man was deal-  
ing in futures. He immediately  
notified the cashier and thereupon  
began an investigation. He has  
been operating in futures since  
about the 15th of August, almost  
the entire loss being in wheat con-  
tracts sold short. The young  
man made a clean breast of  
the whole matter, but while  
the president and cashier were in  
consultation with his father at a  
late hour last night he disappeared.  
Telegrams for his apprehension  
have been sent to all parts of the  
country. Sheriff Hood and assist-  
ants are now searching for him.  
The bank has offered a reward of  
\$100 for his capture, and it is con-  
fidently believed here he will be  
caught. He is eighteen years of  
age, weighs about 140 pounds, is  
clean shaven, has reddish and  
freckled face and hands, and is  
about 5 feet 6 inches high. He is  
quick and active in his movements  
and is dusky in appearance.

The young man belongs to one of  
the best families in this town and  
no man stood higher morally, or  
more thoroughly enjoyed the confi-  
dence of the people.

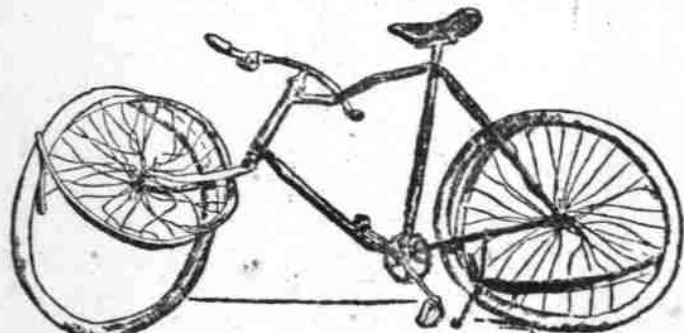
Of course the standing of the

### Through the St. Louis Tornado.

Here is an illustration of the way  
the wind handled things during the  
big St. Louis tornado. This bicycle,



owned in St. Louis, was struck by  
three barrels of syrup, a tierce of  
lard and one barrel of vinegar. Ab-  
solutely the only uninjured parts  
are the saddle and the Morgan &  
Wright quick repair tires, which  
were full of air when the machine  
was found. Even if these tires had  
been punctured, unless severely  
torn, any one of the holes could  
have been repaired by the quick-

ing the quick-repair tool. The re-  
pair can be made in two minutes,  
at the roadside, without taking the
