was procured. If Mr. Fink has found a way to prolong and lengthon out the grape crop he has added much to the value of grape culture:
Editor Standard: Enclosed EDITCR STANDARD: Enclosed you
will find a sample of my grapes, year. About the middie of June I tried an experiment on my vine by cutting back several vines, leaving about three joints of this year' growth. In a short ime came ou whieh brought the second crop which are now ripe. The same vine has about fifteen or twenty bunche half grown. If Jackfrost delays hi coming for some time they may ge on one vine the came year.
