I refuse to believe it, and political patriots moved by action, will not be convinced to the contrary until your votes shall be counted and returned. Will you American citizenship. Holy writ take the earnest advice and listen to this last appeal of him whom you honored with your confidence at our louder than words." Let us prove fast State convention by nominating our political faith by our political me as your choice for the office of Governor? Will you fail to vote for each and every elector on the Bryan Presidential ticket? Will you vote for a gold bug to represent you in the next Congress of the United States?
