The South Educating.
 While the South in the last twenty years has increased 54 per cent. in population, it has increased 130 per cent. in its school enrollment. One in five of the population attends school, a higher proportion than in any country of Europe except Saxony. The value of school property increased in the South between 1874 and 1894 from \$16,000,000 to \$51,000,000. The average value of a school house had risen in that time from \$373 to \$643. While in 1874 the Southern college students in Southern colleges numbered 11,103 in 1894 the number was 25,304. In the eighteen years preceding 1894 there was spent from public taxes on the schools \$320,000,000, of which \$80,000,000 went to the education of the negroes. Ninety five per cent. of the sum is paid by the white taxpayers. In every hundred whites 23 are enrolled in the schools and 19 of every hundred colored. In 1874 there were enrolled 571,506 colored and 1,827,139 white children; in 1894 the figures were 1,424,995 colored and 3,885,893 white—Greensboro Record.

Mrs. Blackwelder Dead.
 The death of Mrs. Mary Blackwelder, which occurred Sunday night, robs Cabarrus of another of the few landmarks and an estimable woman. Mrs. Blackwelder would, had she lived until Christmas day, have been 94 years of age. She was the mother of Mr. Robert Blackwelder, with whom she lived in No. 4 township, and Col. L. A. Blackwelder, the veteran policeman of Charlotte and Mrs. P. S. Martin of King's Mountain. For several years past she had been lingering on the verge of death and on Sunday night her sufferings ceased, having passed peacefully away at 12 o'clock.

Arrangements for the funeral have been made, which will take place tomorrow at Trinity (Lutheran) church in No. 4 township, a member of which church she had been for 74 years.

Coffin Fell on Him and Killed Him.

James Welton was one of the pallbearers at the funeral of Junius Roberts, a farmer at Double Springs, Ala. The coffin was lowered into the grave by straps. The strap held by Welton and another man snapped as the coffin was being lowered. Welton lost his balance as the strap broke, and he fell headlong into the grave, which was six feet deep.

At the same time the rear end of the coffin, which had been held by the broken strap, also plunged downward. The falling coffin struck Welton on the head and banged him against the side of the grave, which was of hard soil. Welton was extricated and died two hours afterward.
