

Special Railroad Rates.

On account of the North Carolina Fish, Oyster, Game and Industrial Fair to be held at Newbern, N. C., February 22-27, the Southern Railway will sell round trip tickets, which will be on sale February 20th to 25th inclusive, with final limit March 2; fare for round trip \$8.20, plus 50 cents for one admission to fair grounds.

The Southern Railway will sell tickets to Washington, D. C., on account of the Presidential Inauguration at rate of one first-class fare for the round trip for civilians, and one cent per mile travelled for military companies in uniform, and brass bands accompanying them, twenty-five or more on one ticket.

Reduced rates have been authorized for the following occasion: Presidential Inauguration ceremonies at Washington, D. C., March 4, 1897. Tickets on sale March 1, 2 and 3, final limit March 8th, 1897. Fare for round trip \$11.05. Continuous passage in each direction.

Our Legislators.

The Senate and House did not agree to adjourn and go to Newbern yesterday but most of them went anyway. The business that received any attention was chiefly of a private nature.

In the Senate Mr. Moyer offered a bill to require a license to carry a pistol.

In the House Mr. Ward offered a bill to reduce the pay of Legislators to \$3 per day. A bill passed to amend the charter of the company which proposes to develop the water power at the Narrows of the Yadkin.

A bill also passed the House to create a board to control the convicts and roads of Mecklenburg county.

Mr. Cook offered a bill requiring the Constitution of the United States and the Constitution of North Carolina to be read in the common schools.

A bill was offered to repeal the Cabarrus road law so far as it applies to township 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 8, 11, 12.

This act seems somewhat mysterious. We can offer no clear construction of it.

A SOUTHERN TRAIN KILLS 9.

Dreadful Accident Near Chattanooga—Of 10 People in a Wagon, Only One Escaped.

CHATTANOOGA, Tenn., Feb. 24.—About 4 o'clock this afternoon, on the Southern Railway, four miles from this city, incoming passenger train No. 7, traveling at a high speed, struck a covered wagon which was trying to clear the tracks ahead of the train at Avondale crossing. The wagon was hit squarely in the centre and with its ten occupants hurled high into the air. The occupants were Mrs. W. J. Woodward, her eight children and one grandchild, all of whom, with one exception, were killed. The ground for some distance presented a gory sight. The bodies were gathered up after much searching, and taken to the morgue, where the nine members of the same family made a gruesome spectacle. The infant, which was undoubtedly shocked to death, there lay like a wax figure in its mother's arms. Every window in the passenger coaches was broken and the engine's pilot demolished. The engineer is absolved from blame for the accident. The father and one child remain of a family of twelve.

An Address at the Court House.

Prof. R. A. Caldwell, a prominent colored man of Greensboro, addressed the colored people of the city at the court house Wednesday night on the proposed cotton mill for that race to be built at this place. His pleadings for them to take hold of the enterprise were handled with considerable force. His audience aggregated about 800 people who were attentive throughout the course of his talk. Caldwell represents some association, and is a stockholder in the Coleman mill.
