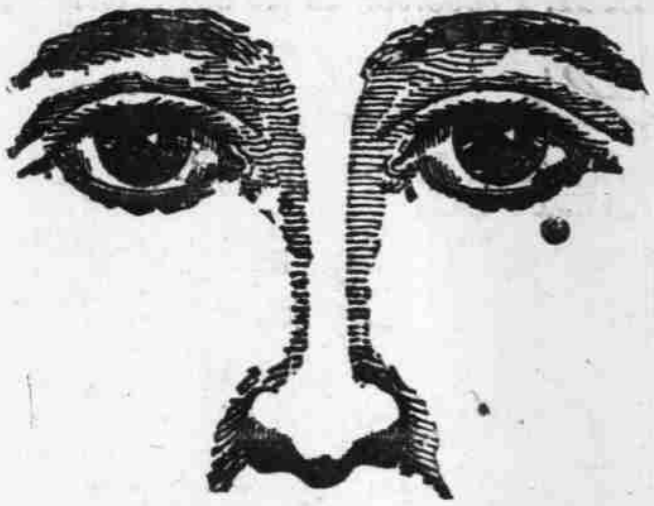

The Cubans are getting nettled at the reflection that they cannot be depended upon, and are said to be aggressive. They drove off some Spanish Monday that tried to keep them from the coast. They promise to distinguish themselves yet.

There is no doubt that the delay to enter Cuba is due to the presence of the Spanish fleet in Cuban waters.
