At 7 o'clock it was 22 below and falling. Excepting Helena, all Nortowestern weather bureau points reported below zero weather. At 7 o'clock, Helena was 14 above, but Duluth reported 18 below, Swift Current 30 below, Huron, Battlefield and Prince Albert 26 below, and Winnipeg 34 below.
