**A Gun Which Will Sink a Warship.**

New York, August 22.—At the Sandy Hook proving grounds today a shell weighing 900 pounds, with a charge of 129½ pounds of explosive gelatin, was fired from a 12-inch seacoast rifle a service charge of brown powder. About 200 feet in front of the gun was a 12-inch harveyized steel plate placed at an angle of 45 degrees to the line of fire. Behind it was a thick backing of oak and behind the oak was a small mountain of sand. The steel target was blown clear up on the oak backing and lay 17 feet to one side and at right angles to the line the shot had followed. Part of the oak backing and the sand behind it were blown away. The bursting charge is estimated to be 26 per cent more powerful than No. 1 dynamite. This test tended to prove that such a shot would sink a warship.
