LAST CALL FOR TAXES.

FOR THE COUNTY OF HARRIS COUNTY: Section 5 of the school law of North Carolina says that the sheriff shall settle the school tax for his county on or before December 31st, of each year and the law also says that the sheriff shall settle the State taxes by the first day of January in each year.
