SMALLPOX SITUATION.

Dr. Lewis Says the Disease is Not Being Stamped Out.

The month of February has witnessed no change in the con without dition of the outbreak of small-matter. pox in the State.

Dr. R H Lewis, the secretary of the State Board of Health, said yesterday that the disease had as strong a foothold as ever. During the month, new cases have been reported in Orange and one or two other counties. The outbreak in several counties west of Raleigh. Dr. Lewis said, is directly tracable to forces of hands working for the Postal Telegraph Company. They spread the disease in Orange, Dr. Lewis stated, and are now in Alamance.

"People over the state continue to diagnose smallpox as chicken pox," Dr. Lewis said. "The disease cannot be stamped out so long as such conditions prevail. Other names for smallpox, which some persons are even inclined to accept are 'ele phant itch' and Georgia bumps."

A physician in Eastern Carolina, who has a state-wide reputation; a few weeks since declared that a smallpox patient had elephant itch. Fortunately the county authorities took the advice of other physicians who diagnosed the case smallpox. Dr. Lewis stated yesterday that there is no such disease as "elephant itch,"-Raleigh Post.
