The diplomaticsituation in China is about the same as for several days and seems best expressed in the following dispatch dated August 31:

The Associated Press has official authority for announcing that the Amerioan-Russian pro posal in favor of the withdrawal of the allied forces from Pekin, with the view of facilitating nego tiations for the conclusion of peace, has not only met with considerable favor at European chancellaries, but it is almos certain to be adopted. In the meanwhile, the question of em ploying Li Hung Chang as a ntermediary is meeting with more and more lavor, and, a he Associated Press has int mated in recent dispatches, will $\mathrm{n}^{*}$ all probability, be settled affirmatively as soon as Li Hung Chang is able to obtain the necessary authority.

There is a growing convic ion in official crrcles here tha the withdrawal of the allies from Pekin is the only practical pro cedure under the existing cir cumstances. Thiere is, howeve no doubt in official circles that will be necessary for the power o maintain their hold of the Ta ku forts and certain strategica points until satisfactory term are arranged and ample guaran tees given by Chira for her fu ture good behavior
