WOULD ERECT MEMORIAL INCOME TAX FACTS. Number Seven.

North Carolina Daughters Want Permission to Place Monument on the Gettysburg Field.

AT THE "BLOODY ANGLE'

Washington, Feb. 6 .- Assistant Seeretary of War Wainwright has explained how the North Carolina Daughters of the . Confederacy shall proceed to erect a monument or marker at the so-called bloody angle, in the Gettysburg national military park, at Gettysburg, Pennsylvania.

In a letter to Senator/Simmons, in response to one from Mrs. Marshall Williams, of Faison, he said :

"The association should submit a written application for authority to Public school teachers in the Diserect a monument or marker on the field, stating what it is intended to commemorate, and the spot upon which it is to be placed. A blue print deployees, and their salaries, or part sign of the monument or marker, together with the proposed inscription thereon should also accompany the application.

It is added that under the laws governing the establishment of the military parks inscriptions for monuments, States nor a Federal judge which markers, or other memorials are to be would diminish the salary that was compiled without censure or without in effect at the time they took office. "Upon receipt of the foregoing papersons in active military or naval pers the matter will receive considera-tion and the association advised as to the action of the department in service allowed under the revenue act of 1918 no longer is allowed.
