Upshaw, dean of students at the University, published in the Alumni Review; Dean Upshaw recites that the new system of pledging freshmen, which was made effective this week, together with a notable increase in chapters and membership, make for a marked improvement in the fraternity situation as compared with years gone by; He continues that fraternities have multiplied with the growth of the student body until now there are 18, that whereas the way of the new fraternity in former years was made extremely difficult, that now the formation of locals and their installation as nationals is now encouraged; that the fraternity of today is larger than that of the past with many chapters having a membership of twenty or more; and that the fraternity men now constitute 25 per cent. of the student body as compared with 17 per cent. a decade ago; Dean Upshaw's article goes into the fraternity situation at the University in a detailed manner, his conclusions being that the fraternities are a helpful force at the institution; Consul Sharps Dead; Edinburgh, Scotland, Dec. 17.—Hunter Sharp, American consul here, died today; He was born in Hertford county, N.
