Third Educational Farm Tour
The Third Educational Farm Tour will start Thursday, August 27th, comprising the following counties: Rowan, Davie, Davidson, Stanly and Cabarrus...

Plans are being completed for one of the best tours that we have ever offered the farmers of these Counties, and the party will assemble at Lexington, N. C., at 8 A. M., on August 27th...

The trip will be made in cars. Ford's and others carrying from four to five passengers and their equipment of blanket, cooking equipment for each car, and provisions, and it will be a good plan to make up the cars in the different communities, taking lunch ready prepared which we will eat with a short stop at Hillsboro...
