Railroad Talk.

The air is full of rumors in regard to several railroads being built to the iron in this country at an early day. We saw a letter from a prominent Raleigh business man a few days since in which says the D. and E. T. Road will be constructed through the iron belt or zone in Stokes. Should this road pass by Madison (without a competing line) it will throw up immense amount of freight into Danville and Greensboro, not only in the way of iron, lime, &c., but will pass near centrally through one of the best tobacco counties in the State with fine timber on every side.

We are well aware that liberal inducements will be offered the D. and E. T. by monied men as well as the R. and S. and the C. F. & Y. R. to run on these lines from where they intersect; but this will throw it twelve or fifteen miles from iron to Stokes and some twenty miles at this point from a direct line from Danville to Bristol. Then from what we know of some of the parties interested in the D. and E. T. they will prefer a road of their own and the money will not be wanting to build it. We are told by a party in town last Saturday that the D. and E. T. had men on the projected line getting the right of way. There are a number of other rumors afloat in regard to a branch road from Ladd's Ford or Walnut Cave.
