And let the defendant take notice that if he fails to appear and answer or demur to the complaint during the term of the court aforesaid, the relief demanded in the complaint will be granted.

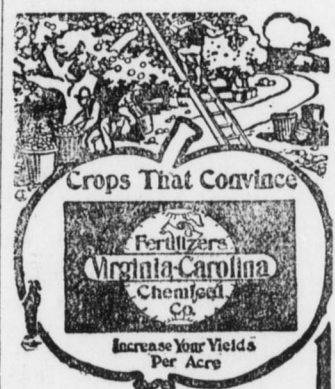
