SURVEYORS AT WORK.

Running Line for Proposed Rockingham and Caswell Railroad.

It is announced that a large force of surveyors are now between Wentworth and Stoneville surveying the Rockingham and Caswell railroad. The Rockingham and Caswell will traverse an unusually fine territory, beginning from Yanceyville, in Caswell county, via Locust Hill, Eastland, Ashland, Lenox Castle, Thompsonville, Reidsville, Wentworth, Leaksville, Spray, and on to Stoneville, where it will tap the Norfolk & Western, thereby giving this section competing freight and passenger rates. The proceedings thus far have reached a stage that insures the completion of the new road at no distant date.
