EXTRAVAGANCE OF CONGRESS

More than once in the past few years the Landmark has called attention to the extravagance of Congress in the matter of public buildings. Unfortunately there is a strong sentiment in this country which causes a Congressman's usefulness by the amount of money he can get out of the public treasury.

In recent years appropriations for all sorts of alleged public purposes are much more readily obtained than formerly, and there is a general feeling that the government is spending money in a wasteful manner.

This is not meant as a criticism of any appropriation for a public building where the building is necessary or proper as a business proposition, nor is it a criticism of an appropriation for any legitimate public purpose. But any one familiar with the facts well knows that probably half of the public buildings built are unnecessary and a waste of money from the business standpoint, and that millions are wasted in other ways by government appropriations.

In short the business of the

government, in many respects, is conducted in a most business-like way in a way that no business man would think of conducting his own business, and yet the same people who demand these appropriations for public buildings and for numerous other unnecessary purposes simply to get a lot of government money spent in their communities, will raise a howl about high taxes and the cost of government, while they are using their influence to have government money improperly expended.

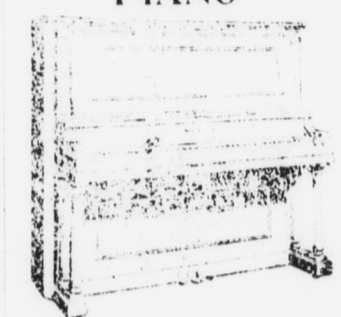
