Saturday, August 3rd, 1912, has been set as the date for the annual reunion of the ex-Confederate soldiers of Stokes County at Danbury. Old Soldiers' Day, as this occasion is popularly known, has in late years become the most largely attended event in the county. A great crowd is sure to be in Danbury on this day. The descendants, and the friends and relatives of the ex-Confederates will as usual provide an ample feast besides numerous amusements for the old soldiers. There will probably be several baseball games and other attractions. Thousands of people from Stokes, Surry, Patrick, Rockingham and other counties will get together and enjoy the day. One feature of the occasion will be about 30 young ladies from back leading the march of the ex-Confederates. This is the grandest feature of the day.
