Some Times It Pays To Be A Tobacco Farmer.

Winston-Salem, Oct. 29.-The local leaf tobacco market is still firm, and statistics show that a total of 7,500,000 pounds has been sold here since the beginning of the present tobacco year, August 1.

Tobacco has brought an average of about \$14.75 a hundred, which means that \$1,105,250 has been paid out to the farmers of this section thus far this year.

The sales started this week with a clean deck, the market caught up with the big glut which lasted 11 days. During that time, a tremendous amount of tobacco changed hands and the average price did not fall below 15 cents a single day during the big break. Half a million dollars changed hands during the break just ended.

Last week's total sales aggregated 1,746,063. This is the largest number of pounds of tobacco sold in a single week this year, eclipsing the sales of the former week by 100,000 pounds. The market average for the week was \$15.54.




