Letter Written During Civil War To A Lady

While looking thru some old papers at his home at Advance, in Davie county recently, Mr. N. C. Forster found the following letter written by a soldier in the civil war to a lady friend, in which he details some of the campaign in Eastern North Carolina. The letter is reprinted below:

March the 25, 1863.

Dear Elizabeth:

This evening affords me the opportunity of addressing you with a few lines to let you know I am well and hoping when these few lines come to you you will be enjoying the same blessing.

I will state to you a little about the last march we was on. We was out nine days and four of them we was in the Yankey land, and we was seven miles from the Atlantic ocean. We tore up the railroad between Morehead City and New Bern and then we left, and in all the route we tuck one prisoner. I saw large Yankey camps where the Yankeys had stayed. One of them had 15 or 20 acres in it. This is the statement of the march.

As for health I have had it very good. I am as well satisfied as I expected to be when I left home, but I would be glad to get to come home and see you all again, and I will ever keep in hope I will get to come home. I have not heard from Peter since I come in camp. Write to me and let me know how he is if you please. There is about 25 hundred soldiers around this place and there is several artillery men here. We fare as well as I expected before I come in camp. I am 15 pounds heavier than I was when I left home.

You can tell all the girls howdy for me if you please. You can tell them I think I will get home again for I don't think the war can last much longer for there is not much in the eastern of North Carolina to see now.

You must excuse bad writing. I will close by asking you to write soon. Direct to Kingston, N. C., in care of Captain W. E. Dece, 62d Regiment.

I remain your respectful friend until death.

Huerta Resigns; Flees from Country

Mexico City, July 15.—Victoriano Huerta presented his resignation as president of Mexico to the chamber of deputies to night, through the foreign relations department. His resignation was referred to a committee of deputies. Spectators filled the galleries and shouted, "Viva Huerta."

The committee reported, recommending that the resignation be accepted and Francisco Carbajal took the oath of office as president of Mexico at 7:20 o'clock before the assembled Senators and deputies. Escorted by the presidential guards, Carbajal immediately went to the national place and was cheered by the people.

HUERTA LEAVES CAPITAL
Mexico City, July 15.—General Huerta and General Blanquet left the capital tonight. They boarded a special train on the Mexican Railway a few miles out from the city. It is thought that they are going to Puerto, where they will board a steamer for some foreign port.

Before his departure Huerta went to the palace to pay his respects to President Carbajal, his successor. There was complete lack of disorder in the capital tonight and the theaters and cafes were crowded. There appears to be a general feeling among the populace that the end of the war is in sight.

Sawing Hard Rock.

The hardest rock is easily cut into regular shapes or slabs by our modern methods. An endless rope composed of three steel wires twisted together is set in movement and draws with it a grinding granular substance, pressing this hard upon the stone that is to be sawn. The cutting substance is grit mixed with water. The stream of water renders the movement easy and prevents the heating of the cable.

The hardest rocks, such as porphyry, are now sawn more easily than the softer, such as marble, but not so rapidly. Marble is sawn at the rate of nearly nine inches an hour, granite at from six to seven inches an hour.

Sure Death to Flies.

Cod liver oil will kill flies. Dr. Lang, who made this discovery, has used it especially against certain flies that are attracted by wounds upon horses and cattle, pestering the poor creatures and infecting the sores. He wipes the skin of the animal with cod liver oil; the flies come and are instantly killed.

Dr. Lang says that ticks on dogs and other animals are killed by a drop of wounds are receiving the open air and sunlight treatment they be covered with cod liver oil, as this will prevent any infection.
