The Board of Elections of Stokes county at its regular meeting on September 7th, 1914, passed the following order, to-wit: It is hereby ordered by the Board of Elections of Stokes county, that the precincts of Covington's School House and Francisco, be and the same hereby are in all respects abolished, and an entire new registration is hereby ordered for Quaker Gap township, in said Stokes county, and the said Quaker Gap township is hereby divided into four election precincts as follows, to-wit:

(1) There shall be a new precinct established to be known and designated as "Moirs," with its polling place at Dr. S. A. Moir's store, and its boundaries shall be as follows, to-wit: Beginning at a point in the Virginia line where the Patrick county road intersects with said Virginia line near B. P. Smith's on the East side of said pond, thence with the Virginia line in an easterly direction to Peter's Creek township line, thence with said township line to Dan River, thence with Dan River as it meanders to the mouth of Big Creek, thence up Big Creek as it meanders in a westerly direction to the Patrick county road, thence with said road as it meanders in a northerly direction to the beginning point.

(2) A new precinct is hereby established to be known and designated as "Frans" precinct, with its polling place at J. C. Frans' store, and its boundaries shall be as follows, to-wit: Beginning at the mouth of Pinch Gut Creek, thence up Pinch Gut Creek as it meanders to the Danbury road, thence West with the Danbury road to the Surry county line thence with the Virginia line thence East with the Virginia line to the East side of Patrick county road near B. P. Smith's, thence in a southerly direction with said road to Big Creek, thence down Big Creek as it meanders to the beginning point at the mouth of Pinch Gut Creek.

(3) A new precinct is hereby created to be known and designated as "Brown Mountain" with its polling place at Brown Mountain School House, and its boundaries shall be as follows, to-wit: Beginning at the mouth of Pinch Gut Creek, thence down Big Creek as it meanders to Dan River, thence with Dan River as it meanders to the mouth of North Double Creek as it meanders to its head or source, thence due West to the Surry county line, thence North with the Surry county line to the line of Frans precinct near A. R. Cook's at the Danbury road, thence East with the Danbury road to Pinch Gut Creek, thence down Pinch Gut Creek as it meanders to the beginning.

(4) A new precinct is hereby created and established to be known and designated as "Quaker Gap" with its polling place at Quaker Gap School House, and its boundaries shall be as follows, to-wit: Beginning at the mouth of North Double Creek, thence up the creek as it meanders to its head or source, thence due West course to the Surry county line, thence South with the Surry county line to the Yadkin township line, thence East with Yadkin township line to the Danbury township line, thence in a northerly direction with the Danbury township line to Dan River, thence up Dan River to the beginning at the mouth of North Double Creek.

In accordance with said order registrars were appointed for these new precincts as follows, to-wit: Registrar for Moirs precinct, Joe Francis. Registrar for Frans precinct, J. F. George. Registrar for Brown Mountain precinct, J. F. George. Registrar for Quaker Gap precinct, R. W. Hill.

In accordance with said order all persons are hereby notified, that the precincts of Francisco and Covington's School House are abolished, and that the four new precincts of Moirs, Frans, Brown Mountain and Quaker Gap are created in Quaker Gap township, and an entire new registration of all voters is required in Quaker Gap township, Stokes County, N.
