Grapefruit Juice Easily **Bottled--Simple Method** of Making By-product.

A simple method of bottling the juice of grapefruit for use in making acid beverages is advocated by the department as a means of gaining a useful byproduct from hundreds of thousands of cases of grapefruit which now are wasted. An investigation was undertaken at the urgent request of Florida grapefruit growers who reported that the market during the season would not take up a large proportion of the grapefruit crop, and asked the department to determine the possibility of utilizing the fruit or its juice in some profitable way.

The investigators found, also, that it was possible to freeze the grapefruit juice into solid ice and 598,907 Pounds Of Leaf then, by whirling the ice in a centrifugal machine, to take out a large part of the water and leave the solids and flavoring matter of the fruit. This freezing and concentrating of the April aggregated 598,907 pounds, juice greatly reduces the bulk compared with total sales of 1,and makes a product which can oe sterilized by heating and kept Of the sales for April of this indefinitely.
