CONFEDERATE VETS ARE TO MEET

Gen. Julian S. Carr, Commanding the State Division, Issues Orders No. 54 to U. C. V.

The following general order from Gen. Julian S. Carr, commanding the North Carolina division, United Confederate veterans, has been sent out:

Confederate Reunion, Headquarters North Carolina Division, United Confederate Veterans, Durham, N. C., Sept. 27, 1915, General Orders No. 54.

Paragraph 1. A meeting of the duly accredited delegates from the camps composing the North Carolina division of the United Confederate veterans is hereby called to be held in the hall of the house of representatives at Raleigh, at 8 o'clock p. m. on Wednesday, the 20th of October, 1915, for the purpose of holding the annual election of commander of the division and of each of the four brigades, and for the transaction of such

other business as may then be determined on.

Paragraph 2. According to the constitution of the United Confederate veterans only those delegates will be allowed a vote or voice in this meeting, who represent camps that are reported by Adjutant General Mickle as having paid their dues. It is hoped that there will be a full attendance. By order of
