State of North Carolina, Stokes County, July 8, 1916.

In the matter of an election in Snow Creek township, under chapter 41 of the Public Local Laws of the General Assembly of North Carolina, of 1913, for the improvement of the public roads of the township.

It appearing to the Commissioners of Stokes county, N. C., that a petition has been filed before said board signed by more than one-fifth of the qualified voters of Snow Creek township, in said county, asking for an election to be held in said township for the purpose of ascertaining the will of the qualified voters thereof, upon the question of issuing road bonds of said township, in the sum of twenty thousand dollars, under chapter 41 of the Public Local Laws of the General Assembly of North Carolina, of 1913, for the improvement of the public roads of the township, under said act; and it further appearing to the board that no election has been held in said township under said act, within six months of the date of this order:

It is now, in accordance with the petition aforesaid, and in pursuance of the act of the General Assembly aforesaid, ordered by the Board of County Commissioners of Stokes county, N. C., that an election be held in said township, under the provisions of said act, at the election precinct in Snow Creek township, at Sandy Ridge, on the 15th day of August, 1916, for the purpose of ascertaining the will of the qualified voters of said township upon the question as to whether or not the said township shall issue twenty thousand dollars road bonds thereof, for the purpose of raising funds with which to improve the public roads of the township, in accordance with said act. Said bonds to run thirty years from date of issue, bearing six per cent, semi-annual interest from date of interest on said bonds and for the further levying of taxes after fifteen years from the date of said bonds to create a sinking fund to pay the bonds as maturity. That for the purpose of holding said election, it is further ordered that G. A. Hutcherson be, and he is now appointed registrar, and that J. T. Joyce and T. M. Martin be, and they are hereby appointed judges to hold said election in accordance with said act.

That at said election all qualified electors who are in favor of issuing said bonds shall vote a ballot "For Good Roads Bond Issue," and those who are opposed to the issuing said bonds shall vote a ballot "Against Good Roads Bond Issue."

That said election shall be held as near as may be under the general law for the election of members of the General Assembly. That the registration books shall open for the registration of voters on Friday, July 14th, 1916, and shall close on Saturday, August 5th, 1916. That the registration books shall be kept open for the registration of voters each day from nine o'clock a. m. until sunset. (Sundays to be excepted.)

That on each Saturday after the registration books open, and during the time they are open the registrar shall attend at the election precinct in said township with his registration books for the purpose of registering voters.

That Saturday, August 12th, 1916, shall be challenge day. That the registrar and judges of said election shall make due return of said election to the board of county commissioners of Stokes county on Thursday, August 17th, 1916.

That the Clerk of the Board of County Commissioners of Stokes county cause notice of this order to be published once a week for at least thirty days next preceding said election, and further cause notice to be posted at least five public places in said township thirty days prior to said election and cause notice also to be served upon the said registrar and judges of said election.
