

ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$9,000.00 SEWER SYSTEM BONDS OF THE TOWN OF WALNUT COVE, NORTH CAROLINA.

Be It Ordained By The Board of Commissioners of The Town of Walnut Cove:

Section 1. That in pursuance of the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act (Sections 2918 to 2965, Volume 3, Consolidated Statutes of North Carolina,) negotiable bonds, of the Town of Walnut Cove, to be known as "SEWER SYSTEM BONDS," are hereby authorized to be issued in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding NINE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$9,000.00) for the necessary expenses of said town to-wit: for the purpose of paying for the construction of a sewer system for the town of Walnut Cove and its citizens.

Sec. 2. A tax sufficient to pay the principal and interest of the bonds hereby authorized shall be annually levied and collected.

Sec. 3. A statement of the debt of the Town of Walnut Cove has been made and filed with the Town Clerk pursuant to the Municipal Finance Act and is open to public inspection.

Sec. 4. This ordinance shall take effect thirty days after its first publication unless in the meantime a petition for its submission to the voters is filed under the Municipal Finance Act, and in such event it shall take effect when approved by the voters of the Town of Walnut Cove at an election as provided in said Act.

The foregoing ordinance was passed on the 12th day of November, 1927, and was first published on the 16th day of November, 1927.

Any action or proceeding questioning the validity of said ordinance must be commenced within thirty days after its first publication.

ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$6,000.00 WATER AND ELECTRIC LIGHT SYSTEM BONDS OF THE TOWN OF WALNUT COVE, NORTH CAROLINA.

Be It Ordained By The Board of Commissioners of The Town of Walnut Cove:

Section 1. That in pursuance of the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act (Sections 2918 to 2965, Volume 3, Consolidated Statutes of North Carolina,) negotiable bonds, of the Town of Walnut Cove, to be known as "WATER AND ELECTRIC LIGHT SYSTEM BONDS" are hereby authorized to be issued in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding SIX THOUSAND DOLLARS, (\$6,000.00,) for the necessary expenses of said town to-wit: for the purpose of paying for the construction of a water and electric light system for the Town of Walnut Cove and its citizens.

Sec. 2. A tax sufficient to pay the principal and interest of the bonds hereby authorized shall be annually levied and collected.

Sec. 3. A statement of the debt of the Town of Walnut Cove has been made and filed with the Town Clerk pursuant to the Municipal Finance Act and is open to public inspection.

Sec. 4. This ordinance shall take effect thirty days after its first publication unless in the meantime a petition for its submission to the voters is filed under the Municipal Finance Act, and in such event it shall take effect when approved by the voters of the Town of Walnut Cove at an election as provided in said Act.
