Eight-Year-Old Son of Leather M. McKinney Finds Cap and Picks It With Knife—Doing Well As Could Be Expected In Winston-Salem Hospital.

The little eight-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Luther M. McKinney, of Quaker Gap township, this county, is expected to lose one of his hands as the result of the explosion of a dynamite cap Sunday afternoon.

The little fellow was taken to a Winston-Salem hospital immediately after the accident where everything is being done that is possible to save his hand, though it is badly lacerated.

The boy was playing in the attic of his father's home Sunday afternoon when he found the dynamite cap and was trying to pick the powder out of it with a knife when it exploded.
