### R. B. HUTCHERSON

Robert B. Hutcherson, son of John W. and Mary J. Hutcherson, was born in Danbury, N. C., Sept. 28, 1881. He was on active duty in the U. S. Army from 1902 to 1904.

He was married June 5, 1912 at Plano, Ill. to Miss Lillie M. White who died sixteen months later.

He was again married Dec. 23, 1914 at Greensboro, N. C. to Miss Rosa E. Carroll, to this union was born 7 children 6 of whom are living, five boys and girl, Robert, Ralph, Raelord, Orman, Kelly and Mary Elizabeth.

Besides his wife and children, he is survived by two brothers, Watt and Will Hutcherson, of Winston-Salem, N. C. and 3 sisters, Mrs. Lillie Evans, Richmond, W. Va. Mrs. Kate Martin, of Madison, N. C. and Mrs. Renie Martin, of Burnsville, W. Va. He was a kind and loving husband and father and a loyal friend.

He made a profession of Faith in Christ 8 years ago at Oak Ridge Baptist Church, but never did unite with any church. He joined the U. S. Army when twenty-one years old, and served through the Spanish American War. Doing service in Cuba. After his discharge from the army he lived a number of years in Chicago and Plano, Ill. He belonged to Jackson Park Lodge No. 915 A. F. & A. M. of Chicago, Ill.

He came back to Winston-Salem in 1913 and to Sandy Ridge in 1919, spending the remainder of his life here, until about six weeks ago, when he went to the Veterans' Hospital at which he died of Cancer of the Johnson City, Tenn. at which River and left him.

Mr. Hutcherson was a prominent citizen of his county. Serving his third term on the Board of Education at the time of his death.

He served the people of his township as Justice of the peace for six years prior to his election on the board, and believes in Justice to everyone.

It was always his pleasure to do what he could for his fellow-man.

The funeral service was conducted from Oak Ridge Baptist Church Friday, Sept. 28. The large crowd present at his funeral attested to his prominence.
