Answer To "Parent's" Why

Lawsonville, N. C. — The PARENT who asked so very many questions in a recent issue of the DANBURY REPORTER is certainly lacking in information concerning their local institution of learning, and information too that the average interested parent should know. We feel that a little information along this line might be of some use to the parent, especially in relation to the Lawsonville school. It may be said in reply to one of the PARENT'S questions that no children are enrolled in the Lawsonville school who live within two miles of Danbury. As a matter-of-fact, the Danbury bus comes within three miles of Lawsonville school building, the starting point being the residence of Mr. M. J. Fagg. Perhaps the parent does not know that the Lawsonville district extends to Buck Island bridge in the direc-

tion of Danbury.

As to the number of new teachers, there are only two at the present time. These two were added for the simple reason that the average attendance last year justified the addition. For the PARENT'S information alone we might add that the number of teachers in any school is based on the number in average daily attendance, and not on whether the school is located at the county seat as the article might lead some to believe.

It is not the policy of the local school to grow and improve at the expense of other schools. Neither do we solicit children for our school who are already enrolled in a different district. We have not as yet visited homes out of our district and tried to persuade parents to leave the local district and send to ours. We do not waste time, gas and oil patrolling the state roads out of our district soliciting and in fact begging children to come to our school. Yet these very things have been done by our nearest neighbor, Danbury. To our knowledge, only two children have left, our best wishes go with them.
