Party Peas

Peas with a Partner... Cauliflower and Peas on Casserole. Separate one head of cauliflower into flowerets and boil until tender. Drain and lay in a buttered casserole, keep the pieces as uniform as possible. Make a white sauce of three tablespoons butter, three tablespoons flour, one and three-fourths cups milk, one-half teaspoon salt and a few grains of pepper. Simmer one cup of canned peas for three or four minutes and pass through a sieve. Add to the white sauce. Pour over the cauliflower and cover with buttered crumbs. Brown in a hot oven. This serves eight persons.
