

32 CHILDREN ARE INJURED

and dislocation of the wrist. Evelyn Marion, 13, scalp wounds. Roxie Chilton, 16, lacerated scalp. Byron McCullum, 18, lacerated scalp and cerebral concussion. Archie Barker, 16, driver of the bus, three fractured ribs; and Elizabeth McKinney, 12, severe scalp lacerations.

Three students had their hurts treated at the hospital and left. Baze Hauser, 19, had a severe laceration about the mouth and he was reported to have been taken to Winston-Salem after the first treatment. June Marion, 15, and Floyd Blakely, 17, were treated for minor injuries and had left the hospital.

Another large group of children were given treatment by Pilot Mountain physicians, some of which were reported to have painful and possibly serious injuries. Among them were Johnnie Forrest, 12, a fractured leg; Junior Forrest, 10, injured knee; Beulah Egan, 18, badly injured foot; and Joyce Hauser, 18, at first thought unhurt and later reported paralyzed. Margaret Holloway, 14, Hattie Smith, 16, Osene Chilton, 5, Dorothy Lawson, 13, Paul Allen, 15, Glenn Marion, 14, Edna Lane, 13, and Carley Dodson, 7, were reported as having only minor hurts.

The bus which was involved in the wreck was a contract bus owned by Willie Gilley, who resides three miles south of Mount Airy on the Pilot Mountain Highway, and was driven by Archie Barker, 16-year-old student. It was the first year that Barker had driven a school bus, but Supt. John W. Comer, of the county schools system, and County Mechanic Edie Reese both stated that the truck had a good record as a driver.

The wreck occurred about 7 o'clock after Barker was making an extra load beyond the usual daily route. The extra load, it should be necessary because the regular Shoals bus was out of commission and had been carried to Dobson for repairs. The regular driver of the Pilot-Shoals bus, Forter Hauser, was not on the wrecked vehicle.

When questioned shortly after the accident occurred, Supt. Barker stated that he was proceeding westward from the site

skips of Pilot Mountain and was heading the foot of a long hill when he saw a man standing on the right-hand side of the highway. He declared that he was blinded by the sun and did not see the man until nearly upon him, and that he then cut to the left and struck the wagon parked on the opposite side of the road and headed toward Pilot Mountain. He further declared that he never saw the wagon until the crash occurred. His report was substantiated by an identical account given by Tom Hauser, who graduated from Pilot Mountain high school last year, but was riding the bus en route home.

Neither Barker nor Hauser knew who owned the wagon nor who the man was that had been standing on the highway, but investigation revealed that the wagon was the property of Dewey Chilton, a farmer of the neighborhood. Chilton had parked his wagon and stepped across the highway to talk to a neighbor, reported to have been J. M. Dalton. The fact that Chilton was off the wagon at the time it was struck was said to have killed seven of his life.

Traces of the wreck were not clear to Barker and Hauser, many of whom suffered painful and possibly serious injuries, but County Mechanic Edie Reese said last night that the bus struck the wagon and was blown from the road that was hit to it. The bus then moved forward about forty yards and struck a projecting portion of a concrete culvert which stripped the front axle off the bus and shunted it down the hill. The bus jumped the ten or twelve feet creek and buried its radiator into the opposite bank, but the body did not collapse and probably remained more or less intact.

Early arrivals at the scene of the accident pulled the children out of the wrecked bus, and a party hurried to Pilot Mountain for an ambulance. The ambulance, however, proved insufficient for the occasion and a lease truck was commiserated to bring a load of the injured to the Mount Airy hospital. A number, apparently less seriously hurt, were kept at Pilot Mountain for treatment by physicians.

The first group of the injured to reach the hospital arrived about 7:20 o'clock and from that time the hospital was the scene of feverish activity. There were many visitors to inquire as to the condition of the children, and parents from the Shoals section

were gathering rapidly as news of the accident spread through the community.

Supt. John W. Comer, head of the Surry schools, also reached the hospital as soon as possible after learning of the wreck and expressed the intention to investigate the accident thoroughly and to see that everything possible was done for the injured children. He also notified Leroy Martin, secretary of the state school commission, of the affair and plans to send more complete particulars later.
