COURT CONVENES MONDAY, APRIL 1

FIRST WEEK WILL BE DEVOTED TO TRIAL OF CRIMINAL CASES, WHILE SECOND WEEK WILL BE FOR CIVIL ACTIONS — ONE CAPITAL CASE ON DOCKET.

The regular spring term of Stokes Superior Court will convene here on Monday, April 1, embracing two weeks.

Judge P. A. McElroy will be on the bench, while Solicitor H. L. Koonz will prosecute for the State.

The first week will be devoted to the trial of criminal cases. Only one capital case is on the docket, to-wit., State vs. Henry Pell, charged with manslaughter. Most of the other actions will be minor, generally consisting of violations of the prohibition law.

The second week will be occupied with the trial of civil actions.
