PUBLIC WELFARE IN 79 COUNTIES

FULL TIME SUPERINTENDENTS NAMED IN MORE THAN THREE-FOURTHS OF STATE — MRS. EVELYN McNAIRY, SUPERINTENDENT OF STOKES.

Seventy-nine counties in North Carolina now have organized welfare departments of public welfare, Mrs. W. T. Bost, Commissioner of Public Welfare, announced today. The recent elections of full-time superintendents of public welfare in Avery, Haywood, Northampton, Hyde and Person Counties bring the total to this figure.

Twenty-five counties have been organized during the past year, which is the largest increase since 1920, according to Mrs. W. B. Aycock, Director of County Organization.
