Death of W. L. Sheppard, Former Stokes Citizen

William Lewis Sheppard, 63, a former citizen of Stokes county, died at 10 o'clock Tuesday morning at Wesley Long hospital, where he had been a patient for four weeks. The funeral was held at 2 o'clock Tuesday afternoon at Reich Funeral home. Dr. Charles F. Myers, pastor of First Presbyterian church, was in charge of the service and interment was in the Green Hill cemetery, with Robert Wimbish, Robert Sills, Joe Westbrook, Claude P. Kirkman, L. M. Johnson and W. T. Jones serving as pallbearers.

Mr. Sheppard, who had been ill for about six months, had been a resident of Greensboro for the past 23 years, having gone there from Mt. Airy. He was a shoe salesman for 42 years and at one time operated his own shoe store. He was a member of First Presbyterian church, a Mason, a Shriner and an Elk.

He was twice married, both wives preceding him in death. Surviving are one son by his first marriage, C. R. Sheppard, of Mt. Airy, and two daughters by his second marriage, Mrs. Harold Wesley and Miss Martha Sheppard, both of Greensboro; two brothers, Robert Sheppard, of Stuart, Va., and Cleve Sheppard, of Randolph county, and two sisters, Mrs. Alice Clark, of Boone, and Mrs. Cutler Handy, of Stokes county.

COUNTY FATHERS THUMBS DOWN

REFUSE PROPOSITION TO SUPPLEMENT SALARY OF LADY DEMONSTRATOR \$600—BALANCE OF SALARY OFFERED BY STATE—SEVERAL TOWNSHIPS REPRESENTED HERE TODAY—WILL ATTEMPT RAISE BY PRIVATE SUBSCRIPTION.

The board of county commissioners, in special session here today, refused to appropriate \$600.00 a year to supplement the salary of a lady home demonstrator, the balance of whose pay, \$1800.00, the State will take care of under the extension department.

Ladies were here from Sauratown, Big Creek, Peter's Creek and Snow Creek townships, urging that the lady home demonstrator, who has not yet been named, be employed for this work.

The proposition from the State was that it would defray the expenses of the agent from Jan. 1, 1938, to July 1, following, if the Stokes commissioners would assume \$600.00 for the year.

The commissioners, Messrs. Joyce, Gibson and Johnson, declined the offer.

The ladies who were agitating this new county department, declared they would employ the lady demonstrator and would engage themselves to supplement her salary to the amount of \$600.00 through private subscriptions.

The work of a lady home demonstration agent was stated to be that of working in co-operation with the county agent, to organize clubs to assist the women, to have charge of the girls' division of the 4-H Club work, etc.
