### WATCH FOR THE STRAW VOTES

DANBURY REPORTER CON-DUOTING POLLS FOR DEM-OCRATIC GOVERNOR AND REPUBLICAN PRESIDENT-RESULTS TO BE PUBLISH. ED BEFORE PRIMARY.

The Danbury Reporter this week has mailed out several hundred ballots to be voted in a straw poll for Democratic Governor of North Carolina and Republican President of the United States, respectively.

Each of these ballots will come from cross sections of Stokes voters. One hundred cards will be returned showing the choice of Democrats for Governor. Also one hundred ballots will come in indicating the favorite of the Republicans for President of the United States.

The list of voters to whom the cards have been sent include leaders of thought and influence in both parties in the county. And their separate verdicts will almost certainly point to the favored Democratic Governor and the choice of Republicans for President.

Both groups of tickets were mailed the same day, and if possible the results will be published in the Reporter of May 16. If all ballots do not arrive at the office in time, May 23 will be the date of the disclosure. But both will be published before the date of the primary, May 25.
