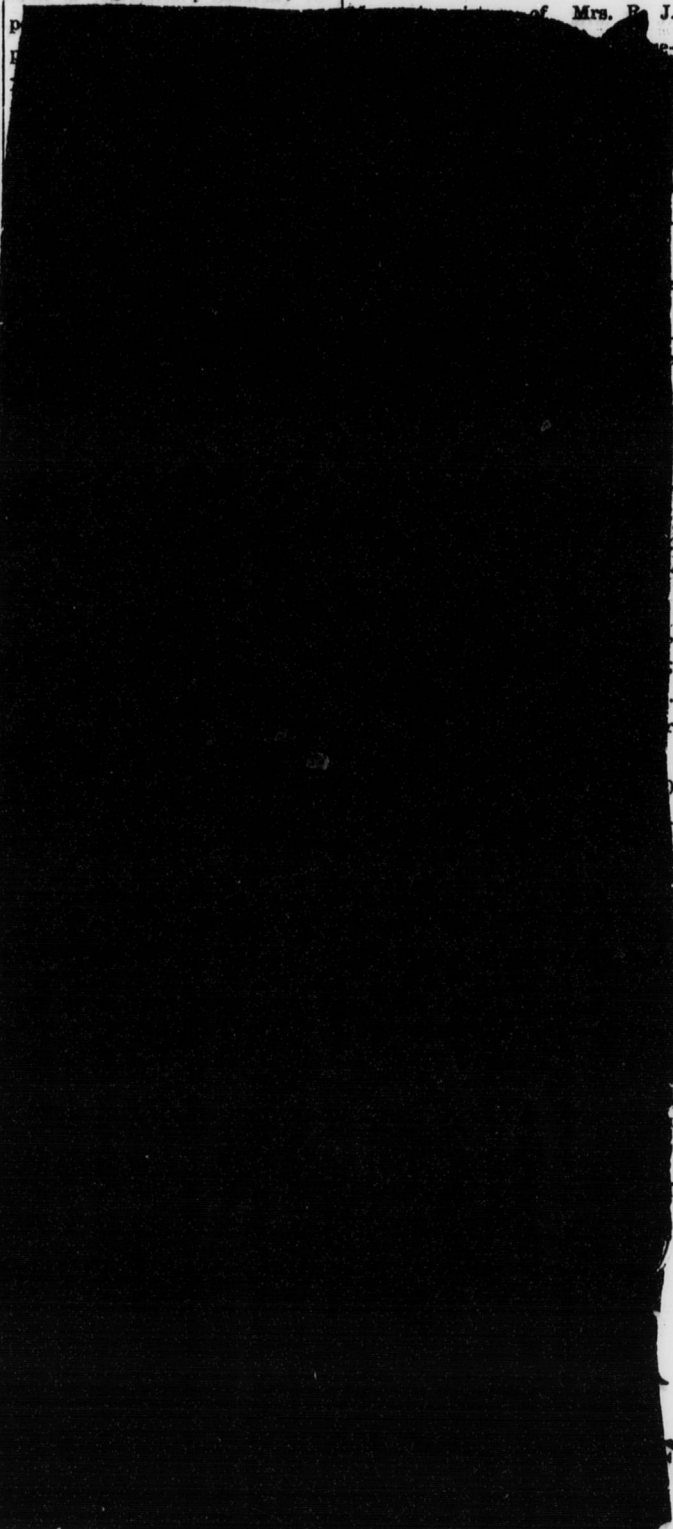

Friday, several farmers and the county agent visited the farm of Bill Fulton, Walnut Cove, and viewed the fine work which he has done building pasture with lime and phosphate. He is gradually growing into livestock farming. Several additional farmers are arranging to build silos this summer.

Mrs. S. H. Shelton sold \$7.09 worth of milk from her cow last month besides the milk used in the home for a family of four—another cow is being added.

Another one of our 4-H club pigs has been placed with Dick Neal, Walnut Cove.

The tobacco in Stokes county has a good broad leaf since it began raining, but the excessive wet weather is causing much drowning and various diseases, which will materially affect the quantity of our tobacco crop.
