NEAL SPEAKS APRIL 6 HERE

VICE PRESIDENT WACHOVIA BANK WILL TALK ON WAR FINANCE— COMMITTEES FOR STOKES NAMED— COME TO THE MEETING WITH YOUR QUESTIONS.
