The six candidates pictured above took commanding leads over their opponents in last Saturday's balloting, and piled convincing majorities to be nominated for the respective offices for which they were running. Clyde R. Hoey, former governor held the greatest majority for the sen-

ate post vacated by Robert E. Reynolds when he defeated Cameron Morrison, also former governor, by more than 100,000 votes. Gregg Cherry led Ralph McDonald for governor by approximately 50,000 votes. Charles M. Johnson, state treasurer, Thad Eure, secretary of State, and Geo. Ross

Pou, auditor, all incumbents, amassed good margins over their opponents. In the Fifth Congressional District, John H. Folger, prominent Mt. Airy lawyer and incumbent, overwhelmed J. N. "Buck" Freeman of Winston-Salem to win the nomination for congress from that district.

Jones of Forsyth county, has been missing in action since the fall of Corregidor in May, 1942. The war department presumes he is dead, and has so notified his parents.

Mr. Jones, the father, is the popular agent of the Southern Dairies, who visits Danbury every week with milk products. The Danbury friends of Mr. Jones extend to him and his family their deepest sympathy.
