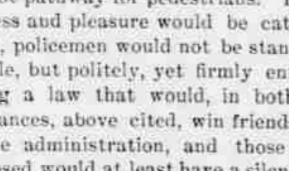

Shipbuilding in 1899.

According to a Consular report from Bremen on the shipbuilding record of the past year, the United Kingdom still leads in tonnage output.

Of the 1,416,000 mercantile tonnage built in the United Kingdom in 1899 the portion built for Germany was 68,000 tons; for Austria, 37,000 tons; for Norway, 28,000 tons; for Spain, 26,000 tons; for Denmark, 24,000 tons; for Holland, 22,000 tons; for Russia, 15,000 tons; for Sweden, 9,000 tons.
