Mr. C. M. Sherrill, the City Manager returned Tuesday from Atlanta, where he has been in consultation with Messrs. Schoen and Tucker, general managers of the Southeastern Tariff Association, with the view, to making some arrangements to have the fire insurance rate of the city reduced. He informs us that the six years until he ordered it done the association would do in regard to reducing the rates if the city would purchase a motor fire truck. The association has agreed to give the city a second-class rate plus a small charge, which will mean a reduction of 15 to 25 ing to the citizens of the city of about \$3000 per year. 

They have bored a well at the water plant 150 feet deep and are useing air pressure to pump the water. The well at present is furnishing 40 gallons per minute, which is just about as much as the sale of water amounts too. A sample of the water has been

sent to the State Chemist to be annalyzed, and if it is pure they will at once use the water which will save the city at least \$5 per day. We are under the impression that two of these wells will supply the city at a cost of about one half of the present system.


