He Proposes \$2,000, 000 Memorial To Lincoln

Senator Cullom, of Illinois, introduced a bill last Tuesday proposing a \$2,000,-000 memorial to Abraham Lincoln. A Lincoln memorial commission is to be established immediately under the terms of Mr. Cullom's bill to be composed of President Taft, Senator Wetmore of Rhode Island and Representative McCall of Massachusetts, the chairmen respectively of the Senate and House committees on library; Senator Money, of Mississippi, and Representative Chmp Clark of Missouri.

This commission is to provide plans and designs for a monument of a memorial of other character.

The sum of \$100, 000 is carried by the bill, so that the commission may begin work at once.


