#### A Remarkable Showing.

The government edict against fur-

ther propagation of the poppy plant in China was issued three years ago. During the period which has since elapsed production, as officially established by careful investigation, has decreased from sixty to seventy per cent. At this rate complete eradication of poppy culture will be effected within the next two years. English observers consider as nothing less than a miracle this response on part of three hunddred million Chinese to restrictive re gulation of the Government; and wel they may, when it is considered how firmly fixed the opium habit had become in the Celestial Kingdom-the yearly output being valued at \$115,000,-000 and even at that, insufficient for home consumption. The result speaks volumes both for the efficiency of Chinese enforcement of law and of the capacity of self-restrant possessed by China's population. It is certain that the United States, under similiar conditions, would not have been able to make half as good a showing, and it is more than doubtfull that any of the nations of Europe could. There are many things which we of the enlightened Occident might well learn of the "Heathen Chinee" if we would only abandon the supercilious superiority with which we are wont to regard the little vellow man of the Orient, -Vir-
