In the capsizing of the Steamer Eastland loaded with excursionist at a dock in Chicago harbor Saturday morning there was destroyed the lives of 1200 people. The second largest marine disaster known to the world, the Titanic leading with 1592 souls. That there is much culpability among those who had charge of the excursion, there can be no doubt. It seems that the steamer, has a bad record, having previously turned over twice. Her building was defective especially in ballast arrangement. It is said her carrying capacity was only 2500, while more than 3,000 people were aboard of her. The boat should have been so constructed that a shifting of a portion of her passenger list from one side to the other should not have overturned the boat. There is assumed grave responsibility by any individual who undertakes to convoy an excursion, one composed almost entirely of women and children, should be handled by a careful and prudent management, and when liking in this essential there is much room to figure on responsibility.

The disaster is appalling, it is horrible to contemplate. If there is criminal responsibility we hope it will be fixed.

German newspapers charge America with duplicity in the expression of Americas latest note to Germany. May be so, may be so, but we hope that Uncle Sam will not hesitate to back up his demands in the most powerful way that Americas army and navy is capable of doing so. We have the same sympathy and respect for Germany we had last August when the war began and no more. Those who read the Leader then remember with what contempt we held Germany pretensions to anything fair, honest, or truthful. We look upon Germany to day as a nation of brutal barbarians vaneered with culture and civilization. There is no change in the Leaders tone in regard to the war, we take a position and seldom have reason for changing it.

Uncle Sam seems determined that he will make the high seas the open road for commerce and passenger travel, Germany wants to convert it into a place for sea pirates, for buccaneers and murderers cut throats, men butchers, Who will have their way in this matter should easily and early be determined, we only say the thugs should be blown out of the high seas.

The famous Billy Bryan in his talk in San Francisco on July 26 says the "United States had no warrent for war against Germany" and further that going to war with Germany was like challenging an insane assylum. This is fine talk for a man who has been honored with the position of secretary of State, a cabinet appointment. His position is in direct and emphatic opposition to the President who he has continually fought even since he left the cabinet. If Mr. Bryan is not a personal and particular friend of Germany, if his sympathies are not expressed for that country as strong as he can afford to express them without assuming a definite attitude of a pronounced traitor to his country then we do not understand the meaning of words. Mr. Wilson is President of these United

States and his expressions relative to the controversy we have had with Germany have had the true ring of a patriotic statesmen, embued with all the loyalty and love of country, and what of Bryan.

Here is hoping that Judge Peebles will not realize one penny from his suit brought against the Editors Browns of Goldsboro We have never doubted the statement made by Brown in substance, that was an alleged libel.

Napoleon is credited with having once remarked that he knew twenty ways to get an army into England, but not one way to get it out. It is a fairly fare guess that those aluminum craft which Germany is reported to be constructing for landing troops on English shores will not be needed, should the landing be successfully made, to take the invaders back across the Channel.
