It is said that W. J. Bryan and Henry Ford, the great automobile man have been discussing in quiet terms of peace to end the European war. If Mr. Bryan could realize for once that his peace chat will effect a peace about as quick and no quicker than the chant of a jay bird, he might learn something, but we are not sure.

Of all the brazen impudence and bold faced brutality that a people have ever displayed, the Germans and German sympathism in American have taken the prize. Their threats to murder the commission that came over here to negotiate a loan for the allies indicated a malignity, and ignoble disregard of law, more violent and contemptible than ever known.

At the beginning of the European war that Germany had been preparing for for 30 years she slipped some of her spies over into Russia and blew up several of her biggest gun works, and ammunition plants, thus leaving Russia almost helpless. Germany took advantage of the advance knowledge of her desperate and devilish resolve, and this is the way she has worked her game from the start.

Dumbas letter to Secretary Lansing in explanation of his attitude in advising the Hungarians and Austrians to refuse to work in American gun factories and doing other things inimicable to the interest and honor of the American government, is a lame excuse, really a smooth bit of falsehood, but entirely suited to, an consonant with the Government he represents. Bernstorf is the same kind of a man only a smoother article.

At this stage of the war game in Europe few would doubt that it is becoming quite evident that England and her allies are needing something else beside food and powder, this war has not developed a single military strategist of a high order of ability among the allies, nor has a statesman come forward to meet the situation, to take the stupendous responsibility of the government in this fearful crisis, and steer the ship of state amidst stormy seas. Germany has got what the allies have not got and she is using it with wonderful skill. It is trained minds meeting matter and conquering it.

It is said that Bryan proposes to go to Europe as a self constituted peace envoy, to talk to the crown heads about bringing this wicked war to an end. We knew Mr. Bryan had an abundance of self conceit, but never thought it would be sufficient to induce him to undertake such a fruitless mission. He will find the courts of Europe, if he is ever admitted to them, possessed of sufficient diplomacy to discuss anything but peace plans with him.

There is the poorest reason possible for supposing that the allies can afford to stop this war until they are able to force Germany to a humiliating peace, because nothing short of a humiliating peace will ever bring a lasting peace, and Germany will never be willing to stop the war until her victorious armies are checked and beaten, and her re-

sources are exhausted, and that time is not here yet.

It is a tardy recognition to the memory of Josiah Turner that the people should in this late day want to do something to show they have not forgotten the eminent service of this patriotic citizen rendered in the days of his states utmost peril. In reconstruction times, (and we were but a boy then) but we remember that Josiah Turner's voice rang out like the clarion peals of a liberty bell, demanding justice for his people, a protection from the carpet baggers rule, the free booters and pillagers, and the despotic dispoilers. He did not mind denouncing Kirk and Holden face to face for the terrible wrongs they were inflicting upon a subdued and humiliated people. Turner was a power and his voice and pen awakened an heroic resentment. He has never had justice, can we give it this late date?
