For the first year the registrations were 1,681 machines, which included all in ope ation in the Township, and at the Court State at that time, and all pur-House door in Dobson, giving chased for the fir t year. In 1912 from January 1st to December 31st, approximately 2,400 machines were registered. In 1913, the office of the secretary of state, where they are registered, expects at least 4,000 registra-

Under the new law, the registration fee is graded according to horsepower, being \$5 for machines of 5 horsepower or less, \$7.50 for machines of from 26 horsepower to 40 horsepower, and \$10 for all


