GREAT SURRY COUNTY PARADE.

On Saturday, June 22, one of the Greatest Patriotic Parades and Celebrations Ever Attempted in the State Will Take Place in and Through Surry County.

The officials in this movement, composed of J. B. Sparger, Chief Marshal, and fourteen township marshalls are preparing a program which will be completed in a day or two and distributed over the county, giving full details, premiums, schedules etc.

A brief outline of the day is as follows: Early in the day more than a hundred decorated automobiles and floats will leave Elkin for Mount Airy. A number will leave Siloam and Shoals Townships come to Pilot Mountain, the meeting point for Pilot and Westeld townships. This parade will then start for Mount Airy. At ten o'clock the parade will leave Mount Airy for Elkin. The judges stand will be located at White Plains. It is thought that the parade will be more than three miles in length. Three stops of a few minutes each will be made along the route, at Piney Grove Schoolhouse, at Dobson, and at Fairview, and possibly at one or two other points. Patriotic speakers will deliver four minute speeches at these points.

The parade is to consist of general patriotic floats, floats representing the Red Cross, the Y. M. C. A., Food Conservation, "THE ALLIES," and the War Savings Campaign. Premiums consisting of War Savings Stamps are to be given the prize winners in this parade. A premium is also to be given to the most patriotically decorated home along the route of parade. Arrangements are being made to have the mothers of Surry County boys in the military service ride in the parade as the guests of honor of the day. They will all be supplied with the service flags by the Red Cross of Surry County. If a sufficient number of cars can be secured arrangements will be made to take other persons and organizations. Two bands and possibly three, will furnish the music of the day.

When the parade arrives in Elkin (which will doubtless be about one o'clock) a celebration is to be held. The people of Elkin are arranging a program there that will be a fitting climax to this great demonstration. More of the details will appear in the circular.

This is Surry County's day; it will be her greatest day; it is going to take work and effort. Those in charge of the day are going to call on you to do your part.
