#### To Remind You

Neither you nor I would hesitate a single instant to share our food or clothing, if need be, with a starving shivering child even to the point of self denial and yet we pass by call after call for help with the Near East Relief fund, because there have been so many calls, and because it is so hard to visualize a condition we have not seen.

Those who heard Bishop Darlington's address at Central church Mount Airy two weeks ago could not help being moved by the agony in his voice when he told of the horror of the memory of the unspeakable suffering over there; and how he was haunted by the children's voices begging for bread, their uplifted hands, and pleading faces—that he would like to forget—to blot forever from his mind—but could not. We have been spared this terrible memory, our minds cannot grasp the vision of such suffering, because we have not seen it with our eyes.

3,334 of these little ones are entrusted to North Carolina. We feed them or they perish. \$5.00 will save a life a month, and \$60.00 will take care of one of these little ones for one year.

In response to the appeal made several weeks ago seven citizens have agreed to support a child each for one year, and others have contributed smaller amounts.

#### Extension of Time to Solve Sewer Problem

Elizabeth City, Mar. 4.—An extension of ninety days will be granted the City Council and the Utilities Committee by the State Board of Health for further action toward the solution of Elizabeth City's sanitary toilet law enforcement problem, as the result of a conference between the Council, the Committee, and H. E. Miller, director of the Bureau of Sanitary Inspection and Engineering of the State Board of Health.

In indicating that the extension would be granted, Mr. Miller stated that the Board would adopt the attitude that the City Council, representing the interests of the citizenship, would naturally do its best to find the most satisfactory solution for the local sewerage and sanitary problem. He was careful to ask that any blame or criticism for the city's procrastination in enforcing the State sanitary law be assumed by the Council.

Mr. Miller cleared up a question, long a matter of discussion here, as to whether the city could compel owners of property adjacent to sewer lines to connect with them. He stated that this could be done, as the result of a law passed at the last session of the General Assembly, which authorizes governing bodies of cities in the State to enact such local legislation as may be necessary to compel these connections.
