EES PHYLICAL WRECKS CAUSED BY FLAPPERISM

Pennsylvania Homeopathic Head Also Calls Volstead Enforcement Official-dom Gone Mad

Chicago, June 19.—"Plapperites" is ringing about inefficient, sloep-tarved, under-nourished physical wrecks among modern city youths, Dr. Clarence Bartlett, president of the Pennsylvania State Homeopathic so-ciety, said today, in an address before

Not only were the habits of the flapper assailed, but the methods of enforcement of the Volstead Act were characterized as "officialdom gone
