NOVEL ROAD TO MT.

The following interesting account of the road to Mount Mitchell, in Western North Carolina, is taken from

One-way traffic on an 18-mile stretch of road is the ignovation which has apparently solved the safety pro-blen on a much-traveled mountain oroughfare, near Asheville, N. C. Too narrow for vehicles to pass, and abounding in sharp curves, the road would present many elements of dan-ger if traffic were permitted to move

in both directions at time.

A solution was found by restricting the travel to ascending traffic during the morning hours and to descending during the afternoon. That this plan was good was clearly demonstrated by the absence of auto accidents on the road during the tourist Is only One of Nature's Warnseason of 1922,

The road on which this traffic problem has been so well solved leads to a point near the summit of Mt. Mit-chell, one of the highest peaks east of the Rocky Mountains, 6,711 feet above see level.
