Carolina 8th in List Surface Road Mileage
 Washington, Dec. 8.—North Carolina ranked eighth among the states of the Union January 1, 1923, with regard to the mileage of surfaced roads in the state according to a report of the department of agriculture made public here today. At that time 16,565 miles had been surfaced. At that time only one state in the south had larger mileage than the North State, being Georgia with 18,000 miles of improved highways.
 During the year 1922, according to the report North Carolina with 2,15.9 miles of highways constructed was third in the Union only to Michigan and Indiana respectively.

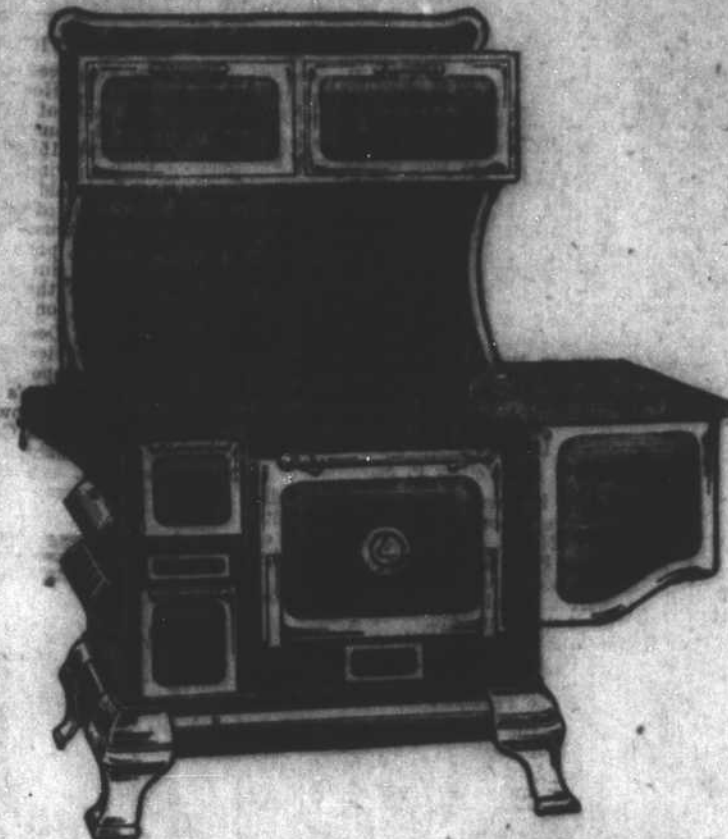

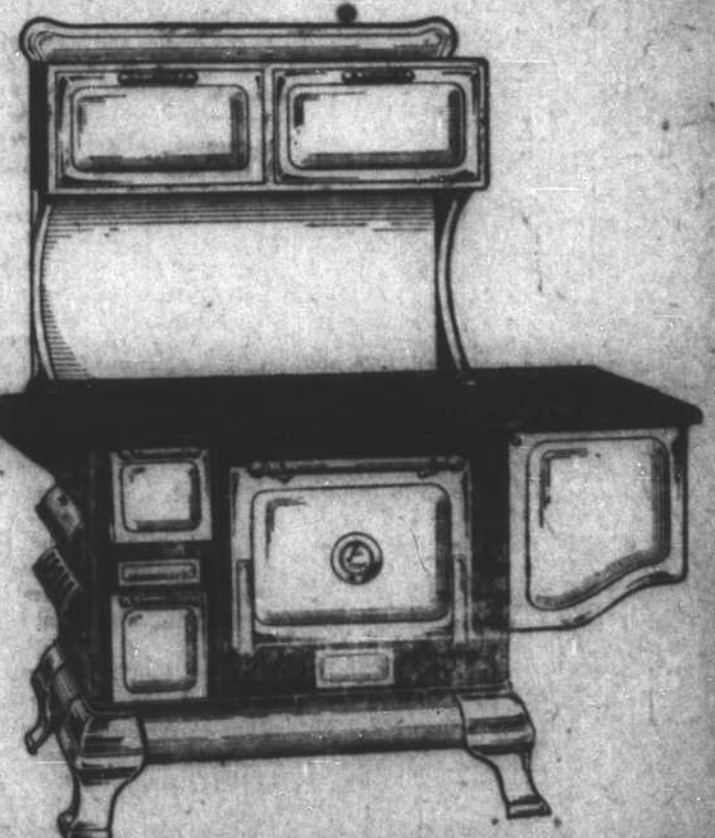
